Covid Boosters and Flu Vaccines

We will also be delivering flu vaccines, as always. Please be patient and wait for us to invite you; we will be running vaccination clinics on Saturdays in October as well as during the week. Flu vaccines will not be delivered until the end of September.

New Phone System

If there are more than four people in the queue you will be offered the option of a "call back". This means we will automatically ring you without you having to wait on the line or loose your place in the queue. You will only be offered this option once on the call so please do select this straight away, we have had very positive feedback about this feature.

CERVICAL SCREENING

Cervical screening, more commonly known as a smear test, is an examination to help prevent cancer. This test checks the health of the cervix for patients aged 25 to 64.

If you receive a letter to book your smear test, please call the surgery at your earliest convenience to book the test. During the examination, a sample of cells will be collected and tested for high-risk types of human papillomavirus (HPV). Afterwards you will receive a letter around 2 weeks later, explaining the next steps for you.

Please try not to put off cervical screening. It is one of the best ways to protect yourself from cervical cancer. If you are feeling particularly anxious about the test, please speak with your nurse performing the exam who can reassure you and talk you through the procedure.

Alternatively if you wish to discuss your concerns before booking in for your smear then you are very welcome to make an appointment to discuss the process with a nurse who can answer any questions you have.



SEPSIS AWARENESS MONTH

Sepsis is a life-threatening reaction to an infection. It happens when your immune system overreacts to an infection and starts to damage your body's own tissues and organs. You cannot catch sepsis from another person. Sepsis is sometimes called septicemia or blood poisoning.
